



## Denmead Infant School Sport Premium Funding – Financial Year 2015-2016

This additional funding has been made available directly to schools to improve the provision of Physical Education (PE) and Sport. Schools have the freedom to determine how best to use this funding to improve the quality and breadth of PE and sport and in turn enhance participation levels and attainment.

At Denmead Infant School we have been allocated £8,841 for the financial year 2015-2016. The School Sport Premium funding will be used to enhance and broaden our PE provision, making it exciting for all children and encouraging life-long participation in sport and physical activity.

### **Aims for funding**

- To encourage healthy lifestyles and lifelong participation in sport and physical activity.
- To enhance the quality of teaching in PE through provision of high quality resources and staff training.
- To improve opportunities to take part in inter school festivals and competitions.
- To develop self-esteem in all children enabling them to become a motivated, independent learner.
